Abstract	
<p>The Health, Gender, and Sexualities CoRE aims to generate ground-breaking interdisciplinary research to address health disparities among gender and sexual minority populations; and integrate public health and social sciences to understand the complex interplay of social, cultural, and healthcare-related factors affecting health outcomes and access to care. Over a 10-year period, the CoRE envisions conducting innovative research, developing interdisciplinary training, fostering international collaboration, and influencing evidence-based policy. Milestones during that period include initiating collaborative research projects, establishing a master's programme, facilitating capacity-building through a research school for doctoral students, and organising research conferences. To promote equitable collaboration, the cluster emphasises the following priorities: fostering inclusive decision-making processes, engaging in collective capacity-building, ensuring transparent communication, demonstrating cultural sensitivity, and actively working towards the decolonisation of research. By integrating social science and public health perspectives, methods, and theories, the cluster aims to generate comprehensive insights and innovative solutions; and strengthen research capacities, foster cross-disciplinary dialogue, and address health disparities faced by gender and sexual minority populations.</p>
